

Aldredge House Victorian Tea: A Taste of History By Mariana Greene

Who knew that high tea is anything but high society? Or that clinking your spoon against the teacup is a sign of questionable etiquette?

Almost 100 ticket holders: parents, grandparents, children and friends – some donning festive hats and gloves - attended the second-annual Afternoon Tea at the Aldredge House on March 10. Guests gleaned such now-discarded rules that governed the upper echelons of society in Victorian America. The tea party, sponsored by Friends of Aldredge House, was educational as well as entertaining. Dr. Evelyn Montgomery, curator at Old Red Courthouse in downtown Dallas, gently guided attendees through the proper etiquette, sharing the dos and don'ts, explained why the afternoon tea party adhered to such strict rules, and clarified how the social customs of the day were code for one's standing -- or not -- in the community. It was fun history in a festive and gloriously beautiful setting.

The taking of tea has enjoyed renewed popularity due to intense interest in the television series "Downton Abbey" and, more recently, "Victoria." Although afternoon tea was invented by an English duchess, the practice crossed the Atlantic to be eagerly adopted by American ladies seeking to cement or enhance their social standing, find husbands for their daughters and benefit their own husband's business interests.

The standard meal, served in three courses, included finger sandwiches, scones with clotted cream and strawberry jam and assorted French pastries. Many of the delicacies were prepared by Friends members, including such neighborhood cooks as Jody Bowers, Michelle Manners, Joanna Hampton and Beth Offutt.

SAHDA volunteers also staffed the event, good-naturedly donning period costumes to serve as butlers and serving maids. Mariana Greene arranged flowers and loaned her mother's hand painted china to tables laden with pink-and-white linens, vintage silver and crystal.

Proceeds from the tea will go toward maintaining the 102-year-old house museum, owned by the Dallas County Medical Alliance Foundation, and funding additional educational programming. The third annual Afternoon Tea will be held in March 2020.
